ACT State Test

The ACT will be given on **February 20th at 8:00am** to all Juniors during the school day at no cost to students. Students do not need to register for this test, they will be given the pre-administration before the testing date during required study hall on **February 12th**. Students do have the opportunity to report their scores to colleges or universities however, it is not required to report scores. If you are a CCP student who takes classes off campus, please be sure to make arrangements with your professors if the time is during one of your scheduled classes. The test will be approximately 3 1/2 hours.

AP Exams

The deadline to sign up for AP exams is **March 22**. Exams are \$94 and the money is due at the time of sign up. Cash in exact change is appreciated or checks made out to Cedar Cliff Schools. Testing dates and times vary, see Mrs. Tinglestad or your AP teacher for a list of dates and times of each exam.

GCCC Updates

Sophomores who applied to the Greene County Career Center on or before January 31st will be notified of their application status within the first two weeks of February. On Monday, **March 4th** the GCCC is hosting a Career and College Fair from 5-7pm in the cafeteria. Thursday, **February 14th** from 4:30-6:30pm they are hosting a FAFSA workshop and a CCP information presentation from 6-7pm. **March 6th** is the next Greene Day for sophomores interested in visiting one or two programs all day at the GCCC. Stanford University

Summer Arts Institute- three week intensive program offering high school students academically engaging interdisciplinary courses in design, music, and architecture.

Summer Humanities Institute- For rising high school juniors and seniors who wish to explore humanities in seminars led by distinguished Stanford professors. The first two weeks students will be studying and researching a topic in history, philosophy, or literature, attending daily lectures, and participating in group discussions. The third week will be spent working closely with professors, graduate students, and writing mentors producing research projects.

Pre-Collegiate Summer Institute- high school students work with instructors and peers who share talents, passions and interests. Courses in areas ranging from business to biotechnology and cryptography to creative writing. There are over 50 courses for students to choose from.

Stanford AI4ALL- For current 9th grade girls to learn more about Artificial Intelligence through a combo of lectures, hands on research projects, field trips, and mentoring activities during a three-week residential program.

Mathematics Camp- Designed for an elite group of talented rising high school juniors and seniors to study in lectures, guided research, and group problem solving.

Online Math & Physics Courses- Intended for students who have surpassed their high schools math and physics curriculum. These courses are offered throughout the year and are mostly self-paced.
