First Impressions and the Cedar Cliff X-Factor

During my first two months as superintendent, I have attempted to attend as many events and meet with as many stakeholders as possible. I continue to be asked on a regular basis about how things are going or how I like Cedar Cliff. I typically respond to such inquiries with a somewhat measured response, such as "great, but I'm still in the honeymoon period."

I don't mean to be dismissive of the question, but the truth is, I continue to be amazed by Cedar Cliff, and I keep thinking this initial amazement will subside. While I'm sure this will be true to a degree, as I reflect on the past sixty days, I realize there is an intangible sewn into the fabric of the district that is largely responsible for the wonderment I feel each time I come to work or attend an event – the overwhelming sense of community!

It isn't just that Cedar Cliff is small that creates this sense of community. It is the collective sense of ownership that seems present everywhere I go. Community members from multiple generations interact with our students as if they are their own children. Our older students validate the attention given to them by younger students. Our businesses and local groups look for opportunities to partner with the district. The group memberships that sometimes create boundaries in other districts – academics, athletics, music, theater, etc. – seem to unite our staff, parents, and students as they cheer each other on, and often participate in overlapping activities or groups.

I was reminded of the importance of community this past month with the passing of Dick Walker, a man known for his love of the community. Even in his final two months, Dick still prioritized attending basketball games, the FFA pancake breakfast, making social rounds at Beans-n-Cream, and publishing a final issue of the *Cedarville Intersection* (in which he welcomed this new superintendent and made sure I was aware of such by spotting me at Beans and asking for my autograph!). In short, I think Dick Walker's active commitment to the community embodies the x-factor that makes Cedar Cliff unique from other districts – the *intersection* between school and community.

I realize I am not sharing anything novel to most, but sometimes we take for granted those things that become familiar to us, and it takes an outsider new to the community to remind us of what makes us special. Perhaps more critically, sometimes an implicit understanding of how things work emerges in places with a strong sense of community, which can lead to complacency if we are not careful. My goal is to lead the district in such a way that we not only honor and celebrate the strong traditions that have made Cedar Cliff special, but we build upon these very same traditions, looking intentionally and strategically for ways to make a very special school community even more so!
